25th Dec. 1928

Dear Wood,

I have just received your kind letter dated 20th inst. for which many thanks. I am much thankful to you for the pictures sent for me. I like them very much. I am rather very sorry to learn that you have met with an accident, but I hope it must have cured by now. The Battalion left its peace station on the 17th of Dec. therefore we are en route to Malakand. We arrived here at Nowshera after a hard, hard marching of 8 days, taking rest for today only & again we resume ^{for the rest of our} ~~our~~ journey to-morrow the 26th arriving at Malakand on the eve of 29th. It is a good deal of trouble for us. The training at Ghelum was very troublesome too. A man would never like to ~~have~~ suffer such trouble. But we are duty bound to bear up whatever the difficulty may arise.
