Appointed MBE, 1956, OBE, 1966, CBE, 1971. Retired, 1971. Deputy Colonel of the Regiment, 1973-77. Colonel of the Queen's Regiment, 1978-1983.

Born, c.1838. Enlisted at Halifax, Yorkshire, 1857. Served with 2nd Battalion in Malta, 1858, Corfu, 1858-1862, Gibraltar, 1862-1864, Bermuda, 1864, and Ireland, 1866. Discharged, 1867.

Born in Salcombe, Devon, 1899. Served in the 10th Battalion in World War I. Died in Exeter in 1968.

Born in Dulwich, 1928. Commissioned, 1948. Served with 1st Battalion in Berlin and as General Staff Officer Grade 3 (Air) with the 7th (East African) Brigade in Kenya, 1953-1955. Attended Staff College, Camberley, 1959. Served in the War Office, and then with the Strategic Reserve. Appointed Brigade Major of 99 Gurkha Brigade in Sarawak, Malaysia. Commanded 1st Battalion in Bahrain and Northern Ireland, 1968-1970. Awarded an OBE for his services in Northern Ireland. Served as instructor at Staff College, Camberley. Served as senior administrative staff officer in the 4th Division in Germany. Awarded Defence Fellowship at Aberdeen University. Appointed Director of Administrative Plans in the Ministry of Defence, 1977. Served as Brigadier of the Queen's Division. Awarded status of Freeman of the City of London, 1976. Served as Colonel of the Queen's Regiment, 1984-1989. Became Deputy Lieutenant for Kent, 1992. Died, 2003.

MOXON, CAPTAIN LESLIE CHARLES ASH (1907-1996), 1915-1978

Born in Tankerton, Whitstable, Kent, 1907. Enlisted at Canterbury, 1927. Served with the 4/5th Battalion, Buffs. Joined the 5th Battalion, Queen's, 1939. Served in France, Apr-May 1940. Was a prisoner of war, 1944-1945. Discharged, c.1960. Rejoined 5th Queen's, 1947. Commissioned, 1956. Retired, 1961. Died, 1996.

MUNRO, GENERAL SIR CHARLES (1860-1929), 1920

Born, 1860. Gazetted to the Queen's, 1879. Served with 1st Battalion, 1881-1886. Passed Staff College, 1890. Served with 1st Battalion in India. Appointed Brigade Major, Gibraltar, 1898. Appointed Deputy Assistant Adjutant General, Guernsey, Apr 1890. Appointed to a similar position at Aldershot, Oct 1890. Served with 6th Division during the Boer War. Served as Chief Instructor of the School of Musketry, Hythe, 1901-1903, and as Commandant, 1903-1907. Appointed to command 2nd London Territorial Division, 1911. Commanded 2nd Division of the BEF, 1914. Appointed to command the 1st Army Corps, Dec 1914. Appointed to command the 3rd Army, 1915. Commanded 1st Army, Jan-Oct 1916. Appointed Commander in Chief, India, Oct 1916. Served as Colonel of the Regiment, 1920-1929. Served as Governor of Gibraltar, 1923-1928. Died, 1929.

MURPHY, PRIVATE LEO NORBURY (1891-1951), 1994-1998

Born in Manchester, 1891. Joined 1st Battalion, c.1914. Transferred to the Royal Fusiliers, c.1916. Reverted back to Queen's for discharge purposes, 1919. Lived in Ypres after the war, except during World War II. Died, 1951, and was buried in the British Military Cemetery near Menin Gate as a special honour.
