Medical registers here include some records which do not record specific details of medical treatment or diagnosis, but have been placed together to reflect the requirements of mental health legislation or patient management to keep the records. Registers are not indexed unless this is noted in the series or file description.

Readers searching for an individual patient whose date of admission is not precisely known are recommended to use either the alphabetical registers (-/5/2/1-8), which were created as indexes to the admission registers, or the general indexes to case books (-/5/10/1-5). The most complete information on a patient's medical progress is usually contained in the case books, 1867-1921; in the Medical Superintendent's private record of patients, 1921-1961; and in the admission registers, 1961-1987, although more complete details for some patients may be contained in case files in list 7173. For patients for whom a date of death or discharge is known the registers of discharges and deaths will be useful.

Information for each patient includes: patient admission number; date of admission; date of any previous admission; occupation and place of abode; by whose authority the patient was sent; date of medical certificate; union chargeable; bodily condition and form of mental disorder; supposed cause of insanity; date of discharge, removal or death. From -/-/-/-/7 registers include dates of last continuation of patient's reception order, subsequent to section 38 of the 1890 Lunacy Act (53 Vict. cap.5) and section 7 of the 1891 Lunacy Act (54 & 55 Vict. cap.65). Following the 1890 Lunacy Act the registers were reordered and reviewed, resulting in an overlap between -/-/-/-/7-8 and -/-/-/-/6. The dates given below are those of admission.

Medical registers, 1907-1949

Created under the 1906 Rules of the Commissioners in Lunacy and consisting mostly of medical information formerly contained within the admission registers. Information for each patient includes: date of admission; patient admission number or general reference number; date of discharge, transfer or death; age at admission; duration of present attack; 'aetiological factors', meaning principal and contributory causes of illness; bodily state on admission; form of mental disorder. Not all patients admitted to the asylum have entries. The registers form two discrete series separately covering male and female patients. The dates given below are those of admission.

Under Section 20 of the 1890 Lunacy Act (53 Vict. cap.5), a person of unsound mind could, before any formal proceedings were taken, “be placed under care and control” for up to three days if public safety or their own welfare was threatened. Under Section 21A, a hospital medical officer could then authorize a period of fourteen days’ observation without a formal order. Section 21A was added under the 1946 National Health Service Act (9 & 10 Geo. VI cap.81 s.50), and required the patient to be kept in a hospital observation ward designated for Section 20 and 21 patients. Brookwood was designated for this purpose by the Ministry of Health in Jan 1957, as part of a policy of replacing observation wards in general hospitals. Most patients were subsequently admitted as certified, temporary or voluntary patients.

Information for each patient includes: date and age on admission; by whose order detained, and date of expiry; result of examinations on admission and discharge; method of disposal from hospital.

The relative or friend then had to sign an order, the originals of which form these registers. The signatures were required to confirm "that the lunatic shall no longer be chargeable to any union, county or borough, and shall be properly taken care of".
